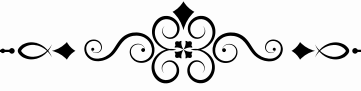

Arrive Kolkata

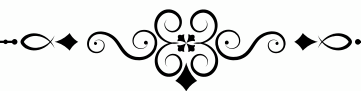
Arrival & Transfer

- Arrive at Kolkata International Airport

DAY 02

Kolkata Sightseeing

Morning — Colonial Kolkata

- Enjoy your breakfast at the hotel
- After breakfast you will meet your driver and guide and begin your sightseeing in Kolkata
- Sightseeing combines Kolkata's iconic monuments and buildings with the buzz of local bazaars and daily life, providing a unique window into multiple facets of this fascinating city
- Start the tour with Dalhousie Square (now renamed BBD Bagh) — the oldest square in the city, part of the "White Town" housing some of the city's earliest and grandest buildings
- See Raj Bhavan, Writer's Building, the GPO, St Andrew's Kirk, St John's Church and several other Raj-era buildings
- Visit Mother Teresa's memorial and the "Black Town" area
- Visit Kumar Tuli, the potter's colony, where Calcutta's famous Durga idols are made

Afternoon — Victoria Memorial & Maidan

- After a break for lunch, visit the Victoria Memorial — the city's most famous monument, built in 1921 in dramatic white marble
- The extraordinary architecture combines European and Indian architectural styles to produce something uniquely beautiful
- The galleries inside are a treasure-house of Raj memorabilia
- End the day with a drive around the Maidan — the vast city park at the heart of the city, serving as a place for rest, recreation and socializing
- Before returning to the hotel, have dinner at a restaurant of your choice or at the hotel itself
- Stay overnight at the hotel in Kolkata

DAY 03

Fly Kolkata to Dimapur – Kohima

71 km · 2 Hours Drive from Dimapur

Morning – Kolkata to Dimapur

- Enjoy your breakfast at the hotel
- In time, transfer to Kolkata airport to board the flight for Dimapur
- Fly Kolkata/Dimapur – Indigo 6E 227 0950/1125 Hrs
- Arrive Dimapur and meet our representative
- Visit Triple Falls and Diezephe Craft Village en route
- Post lunch, drive 2 hours to Kohima

Afternoon – Arrive Kohima

- Kohima's history dates back to when it was an Angami Naga village, formerly known as Kewhira
- When the British Empire established its headquarters in the then-Naga Hills District of Assam Province in 1878, it turned into an urban core
- It officially became the capital after the state of Nagaland was inaugurated in 1963
- Arrive in Kohima by late afternoon and check-in at the hotel – relax for some time
- Early evening visit the War Memorial – honouring the 10,000 Allied soldiers who died during the Japanese invasion during World War II
- Stay overnight at the hotel in Kohima

DAY 04

Kohima Sightseeing

Morning — Dzulakie Village

- Enjoy your breakfast at the hotel
- After breakfast, visit Dzulakie — a charming hill town village with ethereal natural beauty, making it a lovely place to take in the scenery
- This out-of-the-way location is around 40 km from the city center and is well known as the bison's habitat
- The community welcomes tourists in addition to housing some of the rare species of flora and fauna

Afternoon — Khonoma Village

- Visit Khonoma Village — a town belonging to the 'Angami Naga' ethnic group of Nagaland, a pioneering project in the nation
- The local Naga tribes have historically relied heavily on hunting and the natural world for their food supply
- They have abandoned their centuries-old tradition in favour of a more environmentally friendly way of life
- Khonoma is celebrated as one of India's first green villages — a model of sustainable living
- Return to the hotel by late afternoon and relax
- Stay overnight at the hotel in Kohima

DAY 05

Kohima to Jorhat — The Last Ahom Capital

205 km · 5 Hours Drive

Morning — Drive to Jorhat

- After breakfast, check-out and drive 5 hours to Jorhat
- "Jor" means join and "hat" means market — the name refers to two markets, "Macharhat" and "Chowkihat", which existed on the two different banks of the river Bhogdoi
- Jorhat was the last capital of the Ahom Kingdom and home to many historical monuments of Assamese culture
- It is a major urban centre of the state of Assam in India
- The first aeroplane on north-eastern soil was landed in Jorhat in 1928

Afternoon & Evening — Arrive Jorhat

- Arrive Jorhat by late afternoon, check-in, and rest for some time
- Evening stroll down the market area in Jorhat — explore local shops, street food, and the vibrant bazaar life
- Jorhat is the cultural and commercial hub of upper Assam, known for its tea gardens and colonial-era clubs
- Stay overnight at the hotel in Jorhat

DAY 06

Jorhat Sightseeing – Tea Gardens & Colonial Heritage

Morning – Tea Estates & Research

- Enjoy your breakfast at the hotel
- Today you'll do the sightseeing tour of Jorhat visiting the Tea Plantations, Research Centers, and Clubs
- Visit Cinnamora Tea Estate – the first tea garden in Assam, set up by Maniram Dewan in 1850. A treat to explore this picturesque tea garden and experience the serenity of the surroundings
- Visit the Tocklai Tea Research Centre – established in 1911, it is the pioneer institute of tea research and the largest and oldest research centre of its kind in the entire world. The tour includes a visit to its tea estate, manufacturing units, tea tasting rooms and chemical labs

Afternoon – Gymkhana Club & Namghar

- Resume sightseeing after a lovely sip of tea and visit the famous Gymkhana Club – the oldest golf club in India and the third oldest in the world, founded in 1876 by D. Slimmon. Apart from golf, the venue is also used for horse races and cricket
- Post lunch, visit Dhekiakhowa Bornamghar – established by Mahadeva, a saint-cum-reformer. One of the oldest namghars (place of worship) in the state, dating back to the 15th century. An important pilgrimage centre for Baisnav religion
- Return to the hotel by evening – rest of the day at leisure
- Stay overnight at the hotel in Jorhat

DAY 07

Jorhat to Majuli Island & Ziro – Tribal Heartland

120 km • 3.5 Hours Drive

Morning – Majuli Island

- After breakfast, drive to Neematighat (35 km / 1 hr) and then take a ferry to Majuli
- Majuli – perhaps the largest river island in the world – is a treasure of cultural heritage of the region
- The founder of 'Eka Naam Dharma', Srimanta Shankardeva, took shelter in Majuli in the 15th century, and ever since Majuli has emerged as the crowning glory of Vaishnavite culture in Assam
- Majuli has a unique treasure of natural and cultural attractions – a melting point of various tribes
- Rare migratory birds include Adjutant Stork, Pelican, and Siberian Crane
- At Majuli, visit Kamalabari Satra, Mask Making Centre, and Auni Ati Satra

Afternoon – Drive to Ziro

- Board a ferry to Narayanapur on the North Bank of the mighty Brahmaputra, then drive 3.5 hours to Ziro
- Ziro is the administrative centre of the Lower Subansiri district of Arunachal Pradesh – renowned for its cool summer weather, surrounding rice fields, and gentle slopes covered in pine trees
- The Apatani tribe is from Ziro – known for their unique facial tattoos and nose plugs in women
- Before reaching Ziro, stop at a village inhabited by the NISHI tribes
- Stay overnight at the resort in Ziro

DAY 08

Ziro Sightseeing — Apatani Tribal Villages

Morning — Apatani Villages

- Enjoy your breakfast at the hotel
- Today you'll have the whole day at Ziro — the headquarters of Lower Subansiri district of Arunachal Pradesh, located at an altitude of 1,560 m
- Ziro is a plateau surrounded by Apatani tribal villages: Dibbo, Hija, Bulla, Hari, and Hong village
- Hong village is the second biggest and most organised tribal village in Asia
- The uniqueness of the Apatani tribe is the tattoo on women and men, and the nose plug in women — a tradition that sets them apart from all other tribes in India

Afternoon—Village Life & Nature

- Explore the terraced rice fields and pine-covered hills that make Ziro one of the most scenic valleys in Arunachal Pradesh
- Interact with the Apatani community and learn about their sustainable farming practices and unique cultural traditions
- The Ziro Valley is also a UNESCO World Heritage nomination site for its outstanding cultural landscape
- Ziro is also famous for the Ziro Music Festival — one of India's most celebrated outdoor music events
- Return to the hotel late afternoon and rest for the day
- Stay overnight at the resort in Ziro

DAY 09

Ziro to Kaziranga National Park — Rhino Country

295 km · 6.5 Hours Drive

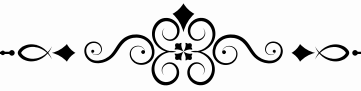
Morning — Drive to Kaziranga

- Enjoy breakfast at the hotel
- Later check-out and drive to Kaziranga National Park — a paradise for the greater Indian one-horned rhinoceros, as well as a home to elephants, tigers, water buffaloes, and many species of birds
- Kaziranga is a UNESCO World Heritage Site and one of India's most celebrated wildlife sanctuaries
- En route, stop at Tezpur to have lunch — Tezpur is a charming town on the banks of the Brahmaputra, known for its ancient temples and scenic beauty

Afternoon — Arrive Kaziranga

- On arrival, check in at the resort and rest for the day
- Kaziranga National Park covers an area of 430 sq km and is home to two-thirds of the world's one-horned rhinoceros population
- The park is also home to the highest density of tigers among protected areas in the world
- Kaziranga is a birdwatcher's paradise — home to pelicans, storks, darters, and numerous migratory and resident birds
- Stay overnight at the resort in Kaziranga

DAY 10

Kaziranga National Park – Safari Day

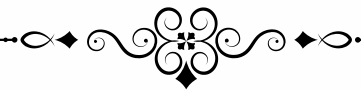
Dawn – Elephant Safari

- Early morning exploration of the park with an elephant ride (subject to availability) or jeep
- Apart from the rhino, other animals you may encounter on the safari are hog deer, swamp deer, wild water buffaloes, and elephants – and if you are lucky, even tigers
- Kaziranga is also home to pelicans, storks, and darters – as there are numerous water bodies to be encountered inside the park
- With a variety of migratory and resident birds darting from tree to tree, the safari in Kaziranga will offer you an opportunity to observe these avian varieties – along with their mammalian counterparts – very closely
- Return to the resort for breakfast

Afternoon – Jeep Safari

- Post lunch, venture into the western range of the park for a jeep safari
- The western range of Kaziranga is known for its open grasslands and higher concentration of wildlife
- The park's diverse ecosystems – tall elephant grass, semi-evergreen forests, and shallow pools – create ideal habitats for a wide variety of species
- Kaziranga has been a conservation success story – rhino numbers have grown from fewer than 200 in the early 20th century to over 2,600 today
- Return to your hotel for an overnight stay in Kaziranga

DAY 11

Kaziranga to Guwahati – Gateway to the North-East

192 km • 4 Hours Drive

Morning – Drive to Guwahati

- Enjoy your breakfast at the hotel
- Later, drive 4 hours to reach Guwahati – the largest city in Assam and the gateway to India's north-east
- Guwahati is one of the fastest-growing cities in India, situated on the south bank of the Brahmaputra river
- The city is an important commercial, educational, and cultural hub for the entire north-eastern region
- Arrive Guwahati and check-in at the hotel – rest for some time

Afternoon – Guwahati Sightseeing

- Late in the afternoon, visit Radhakrishna Temple – a beautiful and serene temple dedicated to Lord Krishna
- Visit the Kamakhya Temple – one of the most revered Shakti shrines in India, perched atop the Nilachal Hill overlooking the Brahmaputra. The temple is a major centre of Tantric worship and draws pilgrims from across the country
- Visit the State Emporium – a great place to pick up authentic Assamese handicrafts, silk, and souvenirs
- Visit the State Museum – showcasing the rich cultural and natural heritage of Assam and the north-east
- Stay overnight at the hotel in Guwahati

DAY 12

Guwahati to Shillong – The Scotland of the East

100 km · 2.5 Hours Drive

Morning – Drive to Shillong

- After breakfast, check out from the hotel and drive to Shillong
- Shillong is the capital of Meghalaya – a lovely city surrounded by pine trees
- Its name comes from the Shillong Peak idol Lei Shyllong, which is revered there
- This hill station rises to a height of 1,496 metres and is renowned for its climate, gorgeous settings, and customs
- "The Scotland of the East" is another name for this location
- The Khyrim, Myllem, Maharam, Mallaisohmat, Bhowal, and Langrim tribes all have descendants here today

Afternoon & Evening – Arrive Shillong

- On arrival, check into the hotel and rest
- Evening visit Police Bazaar – Shillong's prime shopping location where the wares on sale range from electronics to traditional handicraft, modern clothing to handloom items, vegetables and traditional spices
- Shillong is also known as the "Rock Capital of India" – the city has produced some of India's finest rock musicians
- The city's colonial-era architecture, including the Ward's Lake and Lady Hydari Park, adds to its unique charm
- Stay overnight at the hotel in Shillong

DAY 13

Shillong — Living Root Bridge & Dawki

Morning — Mawllynong & Living Root Bridge

- After breakfast, drive to Mawllynong (3 hours)
- Mawllynong is known as the "Cleanest Village in Asia" & a remarkable community that has maintained pristine cleanliness and environmental awareness for generations
- On arrival, visit the Living Root Bridge & a 53 ft long bridge locally known as 'Jingkieng Deingri', which means 'bridge of the rubber tree'
- This bridge is remarkable in that it is more than 100 years old & grown and trained by the Khasi people from the roots of rubber trees
- A living testament to the ingenuity and harmony with nature of the Khasi tribe

Afternoon — Dawki & Return

- Drive to Dawki & the India-Bangladesh border town, famous for the crystal-clear Umngot River
- The Umngot River at Dawki is so clear that boats appear to float in mid-air & one of the most surreal natural sights in India
- Dawki is also a major trade route between India and Bangladesh
- Late in the afternoon, drive back to Shillong
- Stay overnight at the hotel in Shillong

DAY 14

Shillong to Guwahati & Fly to Jaipur – The Pink City

2.5 Hours Drive · Fly Guwahati to Jaipur

Morning – Drive to Guwahati & Fly

- After an early breakfast, check-out from the hotel and get dropped at the Guwahati airport to board the flight for Jaipur
- Fly Guwahati/Jaipur – Indigo 6E 394 1250/1700 (layover of 50 minutes in Kolkata)
- Arrive at Jaipur airport and get transferred to the hotel – rest for some time
- Jaipur, the capital of Rajasthan, is known as the "Pink City" – its old city was painted pink in 1876 to welcome the Prince of Wales

Evening – Cooking Experience in Jaipur

- Later tonight, visit a local home to learn Indian cooking and have dinner at the local home in Jaipur
- This immersive experience gives you a window into the rich culinary traditions of Rajasthan – from spice blending to traditional cooking techniques
- Enjoy a home-cooked Rajasthani meal with your hosts – a truly memorable and personal experience
- Return to the hotel and stay overnight at the hotel in Jaipur

DAY 15

Jaipur Sightseeing – The Pink City

Monuments & Palaces

- Enjoy your breakfast at the hotel
- After breakfast, you'll be met by your driver and city guide to do the sightseeing in Jaipur
- Amer Fort – The traditional fortress of the Kachhawaha Rajput kings at Amber, a beautiful citadel rich in stories of valour, perched on a hilltop overlooking Maota Lake
- City Palace Museum – A royal residence and former administrative headquarters of the rulers of the Jaipur state in Rajasthan, housing a magnificent collection of royal artefacts
- Jantar Mantar (Observatory) – A collection of 19 astronomical instruments built by the Rajput king Sawai Jai Singh, the founder of Jaipur state. It has the biggest sundial in the world – a UNESCO World Heritage Site
- Hawa Mahal (Wind Palace) – Built from red and pink sandstone, this iconic five-storey palace with 953 small windows was designed to allow royal ladies to observe street festivals while remaining unseen

Walled City & Bazaars

- After the morning exploration, enjoy your lunch at a restaurant of your choice
- Post lunch, continue with your sightseeing of the Walled City of Jaipur
- You will be shown not only the monuments and palaces of this legendary wealthy city, but also the temples, crafts and guilds patronized by the rulers
- Stroll through the walled city of Jaipur – explore the spices, sweets, and colourful bazaars
- Optional activities: Hot air balloon ride above Hawa Mahal, Amber Fort and Samode Palace for a 360-degree view of the Pink City; or Bathe the Elephants at Dera Amer
- Return to your hotel by late evening to relax
- Stay overnight at the hotel in Jaipur

DAY 16

Jaipur to Agra via Fatehpur Sikri & Abhaneri Stepwell

250 km • 4.5 Hours Drive

Morning — En Route Stops

- Enjoy your breakfast at the hotel
- After breakfast, check-out and drive to Agra — the City of the Taj Mahal — in your private vehicle
- En route to Agra, make a stop to visit the Abhaneri Stepwell (Chand Baori) — one of the most beautiful and the largest stepwells in the world, with 3,500 narrow steps arranged in perfect geometric symmetry descending 13 storeys into the earth
- After visiting Abhaneri, resume your drive to Agra
- Make a stop to visit Fatehpur Sikri — popularly known as the abandoned Capital City, built by Emperor Akbar in 1571 and abandoned just 14 years later. A UNESCO World Heritage Site (allow additional 2 hours for the visit)
- After the visit, have lunch at Fatehpur Sikri and resume your drive to Agra

Evening — Arrive Agra

- Arrive in Agra by late afternoon — the city of the Taj Mahal — and check-in at your hotel
- Later in the evening, meet your guide and driver for visiting Itimad-ud-Daulah (Baby Taj) — a Mughal mausoleum on the western bank of the Yamuna River. Also known as the Jewel Box or Baby Taj, it is considered a precursor to the Taj Mahal
- After this, enjoy a sunset view of the Taj Mahal from the other side of the Yamuna River (Mehtab Bagh)
- Before returning to the hotel, enjoy shopping and dinner at a restaurant of your choice
- Stay overnight at the hotel in Agra

DAY 17

Agra to Delhi — Taj Mahal at Sunrise & Agra Fort

220 km • 3.5 Hours Drive

Dawn — Taj Mahal at Sunrise

- Early morning, meet your city guide and driver for a sunrise visit to the Taj Mahal
- The Taj Mahal at sunrise is one of the most breathtaking sights in the world — the white marble glows in shades of pink and gold as the first light of day touches its surface
- Built by Emperor Shah Jahan in memory of his beloved wife Mumtaz Mahal, the Taj Mahal is the world's greatest monument to love — a UNESCO World Heritage Site
- Return to the hotel for breakfast

Morning — Agra Fort & Drive to Delhi

- Post breakfast, check-out and visit Agra Fort — built by three generations of Mughal Emperors. Akbar built the walls and gates, his grandson Shah Jahan erected many of the ethereal buildings inside it, and his great-grandson Aurangzeb built the ramparts. A UNESCO World Heritage Site
- After saying goodbye to your guide, start your 3.5-hour drive to Delhi — the Capital City of India
- Arrive in Delhi and check-in at the hotel
- Rest of the evening at leisure — explore Connaught Place or enjoy dinner at a restaurant of your choice
- Stay overnight at the hotel in Delhi

DAY 18

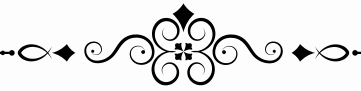
Delhi Sightseeing – New Delhi & Old Delhi

Morning – New Delhi

- Enjoy your breakfast at the hotel
- After breakfast, meet your driver and guide and begin your sightseeing in New Delhi
- Lodhi Gardens – One of Delhi's favourite spots for morning walkers, joggers, and yoga enthusiasts, set amid the tombs of the Sayyid and Lodi dynasties
- Humayun's Tomb – Built in 1570, culturally significant as it was the first garden-tomb on the Indian subcontinent and considered a predecessor of the Taj Mahal. A UNESCO World Heritage Site
- Qutab Minar – Built at the site of Lal Kot, the first city of Delhi. A UNESCO World Heritage Site that marks the arrival of Islamic rule in India
- Enjoy your lunch at a restaurant of your choice
- Post lunch, explore the legacy of the British Raj as you drive past the British Colonial Buildings: President's House, Parliament House, India Gate, Raj Path (King's Way), Janpath (Queen's Way), government official bungalows, Connaught Place, and surroundings

Afternoon – Old Delhi

- Reach Old Delhi and explore the Old City by walking or through a Rickshaw ride
- Jama Masjid – The largest mosque in India, built by Emperor Shah Jahan, capable of holding 25,000 worshippers
- Gurudwara Sees Ganj – A revered Sikh temple in the heart of Old Delhi
- Chandni Chowk – Home to silversmiths, repair shops, clothiers, spicy street food vendors and traditional sweetmeat shops
- Explore not just the bazaar, but also the cultural landscape of Old Delhi – full of smells, sights and sounds to leave you overwhelmed
- Late evening, optionally visit Akshardham Temple or stroll through Dilli Haat (Handicraft Bazaar)
- Before returning to the hotel, have dinner at a restaurant of your choice
- Stay overnight at the hotel in Delhi

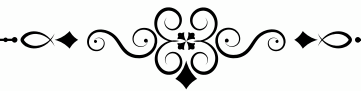
