# Arrive Chennai – Gateway to the Dravidian South

*Chennai (formerly Madras) is the cultural capital of South India – a vibrant metro polis on the Coromandel Coast where ancient Dravidian temples stand alongside colonial churches, and the world's longest urban beach stretches for 13 kilometres along the Bay of Bengal. As the cradle of Bharatanatyam dance and Carnatic music, Chennai sets the perfect tone for a journey through Tamil Nadu's extraordinary heritage.*

## Arrival & Welcome

- Arrive at Chennai International Airport; clear customs and immigration formalities
- Be warmly greeted by your Epic Indian Travel representative with a flower bouquet and name board
- Transfer to your hotel by private vehicle
- Assisted check-in at your hotel

## Kapaleeswarar Temple

- Afternoon visit to the magnificent 7th-century Dravidian Shiva temple in Mylapore
- Marvel at the soaring 37-metre gopuram adorned with hundreds of colourful stucco figures
- Explore the sacred tank and the vibrant temple bazaar surrounding the complex

## Parthasarathy Temple

- Visit one of Chennai's oldest Vishnu temples, built by the Pallavas in the 8th century
- Admire the intricate carvings and the serene sanctum dedicated to Lord Krishna as Parthasarathy

## Marina Beach & Evening

- Evening stroll along Marina Beach – the world's second longest urban beach at 13 km
- Watch the golden sunset over the Bay of Bengal, lined with food stalls and local life
- Welcome dinner at your hotel or a nearby restaurant

DAY 02

# Chennai — Fort St George, San Thome & Tirupati Excursion

*Today blends Chennai's colonial and sacred heritage—from the imposing ramparts of India's first English fortress to the revered tomb of St Thomas the Apostle—before an optional excursion to one of the world's most visited pilgrimage sites, the hill top shrine of Lord Venkateswara at Tirupati.*

## Morning — Fort St George & Colonial Chennai

- After breakfast, depart for a guided tour of Fort St George (1644) — India's first English fortress
- Explore the Fort Museum housing colonial artefacts, portraits, weapons and the original flagstaff
- Visit San Thome Cathedral — a neo-Gothic basilica built over the tomb of St Thomas the Apostle
- One of Christianity's most sacred sites in Asia, with a crypt museum beneath the altar

## Midday — Government Museum

- Visit one of India's oldest museums, established in 1851
- Explore the remarkable collection of South Indian bronzes, Amaravati sculptures and Pallava antiquities
- Browse the natural history and numismatics galleries

## Afternoon — Tirupati Excursion (Optional)

- Optional drive to Tirupati (approx. 3 hours) to visit the Sri Venkateswara Temple atop Tirumala Hills
- One of the world's most visited pilgrimage sites, receiving over 50,000 devotees daily
- Witness the grandeur of the hilltop shrine and the deeply moving atmosphere of mass devotion
- Return to Chennai by evening

- Dinner at your hotel or a local restaurant
- Overnight at your hotel in Chennai

# Chennai to Mahabalipuram – UNESCO Rock-Cut Wonders on the Shore

*The drive south from Chennai along the East Coast Road is one of Tamil Nadu's most scenic – the Bay of Bengal shimmering to the left, casuarina groves lining the road, and the ancient port town of Mahabalipuram rising ahead. Once the maritime capital of the Pallava dynasty, Mahabalipuram is a UNESCO World Heritage Site of extraordinary richness – a 7th and 8th-century open-air museum of rock-cut temples, monolithic rathas, sculpted cave sanctuaries and the world's largest bas-relief, all carved directly from living granite boulders along the Coromandel Coast.*

## Morning – Departure & En Route

- After breakfast, check out of your Chennai hotel
- Drive south along the scenic East Coast Road (approx. 60 km · 1.5 hours)
- En route, optional stop at Dakshina Chitra – a living heritage museum showcasing traditional South Indian homes, crafts and performing arts
- Arrive Mahabalipuram and check into your beach resort

## Afternoon – Shore Temple & Five Rathas

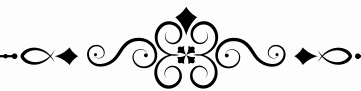
- Visit the Shore Temple – an 8th-century structural temple standing at the water's edge, one of the oldest stone temples in South India
- Explore the Five Rathas (Pancha Rathas) – five monolithic temple chariots carved from single granite boulders, each in a different Dravidian architectural style
- Each ratha is named after a Pandava hero from the Mahabharata

## Late Afternoon – Arjuna's Penance & Cave Temples

- Stand before Arjuna's Penance – the world's largest open-air bas-relief, a 27-metre-wide granite canvas depicting scenes from the Mahabharata and the descent of the Ganges
- Explore the rock-cut cave temples including Mahishasuramardini Cave with its exquisite sculptural panels
- Visit Krishna's Butter Ball – a giant natural granite boulder balanced impossibly on a smooth slope

## Evening at Leisure

- Stroll along Mahabalipuram beach at sunset
- Dinner at your resort or a local seafood restaurant
- Overnight at your beach resort in Mahabalipuram



DAY 04

# Mahabalipuram to Pondicherry – The French Riviera of the East

*The road from Mahabalipuram to Pondicherry hugs the Coromandel Coast through fishing villages and salt flats, arriving at one of India's most unique destinations – a former French colonial enclave where bougainvillea-draped villas line cobble stone streets, the air carries the scent of incense and espresso, and the spiritual legacy of Sri Aurobindo and the Mother draws seekers from across the world. Pondicherry (Puducherry) is a town of extraordinary contrasts – part ashram, part beach town, part living museum of French India.*

## Morning – Departure & Arrival

- After breakfast, check out of your Mahabalipuram resort
- Scenic coastal drive to Pondicherry (approx. 100 km · 2 hours)
- En route, optional stop at the Crocodile Bank – a reptile conservation centre housing over 2,500 crocodiles and rare gharials
- Arrive Pondicherry and check in to your heritage hotel in the French Quarter

## Evening – French Quarter Heritage Walk

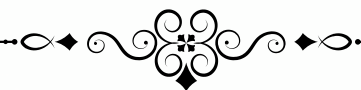
- Stroll through the French Quarter's pastel-painted streets – Rue de la Paix, Rue Suffren and the elegant Goubert Avenue promenade
- Visit the French War Memorial and the iconic beachfront promenade at sunset
- Explore the vibrant cafés, boutiques and galleries of the White Town
- Dinner at a French-Tamil fusion restaurant in the heritage quarter

## Afternoon – Aurobindo Ashram & Auroville

- Visit Sri Aurobindo Ashram – a spiritual community founded in 1926, with a serene meditation hall and the samadhi of Sri Aurobindo and the Mother
- Drive to Auroville – the visionary international township founded in 1968, dedicated to human unity
- Visit the Matrimandir – a stunning golden sphere at the heart of Auroville, used for silent meditation

- Overnight at your heritage hotel in Pondicherry



# Pondicherry to Thanjavur – Heart of the Chola Empire

*The drive west from Pondicherry crosses the fertile Kaveri river delta – the rice bowl of Tamil Nadu – arriving at Thanjavur (Tanjore), the ancient capital of the great Chola dynasty. For over four centuries, the Cholas ruled from this city and raised some of the most magnificent temple architecture the world has ever seen. Thanjavur is also the birthplace of Bharatanatyam dance, Carnatic music and the celebrated Tanjore painting tradition – a city where art, devotion and royal ambition fused into an enduring civilisation.*

## Morning – Departure & En Route

- After breakfast, check out of your Pondicherry hotel
- Drive to Thanjavur via the scenic Kaveri delta (approx. 160 km · 3 hours)
- En route, stop at Gangaikonda Cholapuram – the forgotten Chola capital built by Rajendra Chola I in 1035 AD
- Explore the magnificent Brihadeeswara Temple here – a near-twin of the Thanjavur temple, set in serene rural surroundings
- Arrive Thanjavur and check into your hotel

## Afternoon – Brihadeeswara Temple (UNESCO)

- Visit the Brihadeeswara Temple – a UNESCO World Heritage Site and the crowning achievement of Chola architecture
- Built by Raja Raja Chola I in 1010 AD, the 66-metre vimana (tower) is one of the tallest in India
- Marvel at the massive Nandi monolith, the exquisite frescoes inside the sanctum and the perfectly proportioned granite construction
- The temple was built without mortar – a testament to the extraordinary engineering of the Chola craftsmen

## Late Afternoon – Thanjavur Palace & Saraswathi Mahal

- Visit the Thanjavur Maratha Palace – a sprawling royal complex with a magnificent bell tower and art gallery
- Explore the Saraswathi Mahal Library – one of Asia's oldest libraries, housing over 60,000 manuscripts in Tamil, Sanskrit, Telugu and Marathi
- Browse the Royal Palace Museum's collection of Chola bronzes, stone sculptures and Tanjore paintings

## Evening – Tanjore Painting Workshop

- Visit a traditional Tanjore painting studio – watch master craftsmen apply gold foil and semi-precious stones to create these iconic devotional artworks
- Opportunity to purchase authentic pieces directly from the artists
- Dinner at your hotel and overnight stay in Thanjavur

# Thanjavur Sightseeing – Chola Bronzes, Kumbakonam Temples & Kaveri Delta

*A full day to explore the extraordinary cultural landscape around Thanjavur—from the sacred temple town of Kumbakonam, whereover 180 temples crowd a single town, to the ancient Chola bronze foundries still producing masterpieces using the lost-wax technique perfected at home and years ago. The Kaveri delta that surrounds Thanjavur is one of the most densely temple-studded landscapes on earth—every village has its own ancient shrine, and the air is thick with the scent of camphor and jasmine.*

## Morning – Kumbakonam Temple Town

- After breakfast, drive to Kumbakonam (approx. 40 km · 1 hour)
- Visit the Adi Kumbeswarar Temple – a magnificent Shiva temple with a towering 9-storey gopuram and sacred tank
- Explore the Sarangapani Temple – one of the 108 Divya Desams (sacred Vishnu shrines), with a remarkable chariot-shaped gopuram
- Visit the Mahamaham Tank – a sacred bathing tank where a grand festival is held every 12 years, drawing millions of pilgrims
- Browse the famous Kumbakonam silk weaving workshops – the town is renowned for its fine silk sarees

## Midday – Darasuram & Airavatesvara Temple (UNESCO)

- Visit the Airavatesvara Temple at Darasuram – a UNESCO World Heritage Site built by Rajaraja Chola II in the 12th century
- A jewel of Chola architecture, the temple features a remarkable stone chariot and exquisite miniature sculptures
- Enjoy lunch at a local restaurant in Kumbakonam

## Afternoon – Chola Bronze Foundry

- Return to Thanjavur and visit a traditional bronze casting workshop
- Watch artisans practise the ancient Panchaloha (five-metal alloy) lost-wax casting technique, unchanged since the Chola period
- See the creation of iconic Nataraja (Dancing Shiva) bronzes – among the most celebrated sculptures in world art history
- Opportunity to purchase authentic bronzes directly from the foundry

## Evening – Thanjavur at Leisure

- Visit the Schwartz Church – an 18th-century church built by the Maratha king Serfoji II in honour of a Danish missionary
- Evening walk through the old town market – fragrant with jasmine garlands, fresh produce and temple offerings
- Dinner at your hotel in Thanjavur

DAY 07

# Thanjavur to Madurai – City of the Eternal Temple

*The drive south-west from Thanjavur to Madurai crosses the heart land of Tamil Nadu—a landscape of paddy fields, banana groves and roadside shrines – arriving at one of India's oldest continuously inhabited cities. Madurai has been a centre of Tamil culture, scholarship and devotion for over 2,500 years. At its heart stands the Meenakshi Amman Temple – a living, breathing city within a city, where 33,000 sculptures adorn 14 soaring gopurams and over 15,000 devotees pass through its gates every single day.*

## Morning – Departure from Thanjavur

After breakfast, check out of your Thanjavur hotel

Drive south-west to Madurai (approx. 170 km · 3.5 hours)

En route, optional stop at the Rockfort Temple in Trichy – a dramatic 7th-century Pallava temple perched atop an 83-metre granite rock

Visit the Sri Ranganathaswamy Temple at Srirangam – the largest functioning Hindu temple in the world, covering 156 acres with 21 gopurams

Arrive Madurai and check in to your hotel

## Afternoon – Meenakshi Amman Temple

Visit the legendary Meenakshi Amman Temple – one of the greatest temples in India and a masterpiece of Dravidian architecture

Marvel at the 14 towering gopurams, the tallest rising to 52 metres and covered in over 33,000 painted stucco sculptures

Explore the Hall of a Thousand Pillars – each pillar carved with a different figure, producing musical notes when tapped

Witness the evening Alankaram (adornment) ceremony – a deeply moving ritual of devotion

## Evening – Thirumalai Nayakkar Palace

Visit the Thirumalai Nayakkar Palace – a 17th-century Indo-Saracenic palace with a magnificent 15-metre-high audience hall

Explore the ornate stucco work, massive pillars and the atmospheric courtyard of this royal masterpiece

Watch the Sound & Light Show at the palace – a dramatic narration of Madurai's history

## Madurai by Night

Experience the magical atmosphere of Madurai's old city at night – the temple gopurams illuminated against the sky

Stroll through the flower market near the temple – Madurai is famous for its jasmine (Madurai Malli), sold by the kilogram

Dinner at a traditional Madurai restaurant – try the famous Madurai Kari Dosa and Jigarthanda

Overnight at your hotel in Madurai

DAY 08

# Madurai Sightseeing – Gandhi Museum, Vaigai & Chettinad Flavours

*A full day in Madurai – one of the world's oldest living cities and the cultural capital of Tamil Nadu. Beyond the great temple, Madurai rewards the curious traveller with a Gandhi Museum of rare historical depth, the ancient Vaigai river front, vibrant textile market and the extraordinary cuisine of the Chettinad region – a bold, aromatic cooking tradition that is among the most complex in all of India.*

## Morning – Gandhi Museum & Vaigai River

- After breakfast, visit the Gandhi Museum – housed in the Tamukkam Palace where Gandhi stayed in 1946
- One of India's finest Gandhi museums, with a remarkable collection of photographs, documents and the blood-stained dhoti worn at his assassination
- Walk along the Vaigai River – the ancient river that has flowed through Madurai's history for millennia
- Visit the Kazimar Big Mosque – a 14th-century mosque reflecting Madurai's rich multi-faith heritage

## Midday – Meenakshi Temple Morning Rituals

- Return to the Meenakshi Amman Temple for the morning puja (worship ceremony) – a profoundly atmospheric experience
- Explore the temple's inner sanctums, the golden lotus tank and the museum of temple art
- Enjoy a traditional Madurai lunch – banana leaf meal with rice, sambar, rasam and an array of chutneys and curries

## Afternoon – Textile Markets & Silk Weaving

- Explore Madurai's famous textile bazaars – the city is one of South India's premier centres for silk sarees, cotton fabrics and traditional dress
- Visit a silk weaving workshop to see the intricate process of creating Kanjivaram and Madurai cotton sarees
- Browse the aromatic spice market near the temple – cardamom, star anise, kalpasi and Chettinad spice blends

## Evening – Alagar Kovil Excursion

- Drive to Alagar Kovil (approx. 20 km) – a beautiful Vishnu temple set in the forested Alagar Hills
- The scenic drive through the hills is as rewarding as the temple itself
- Return to Madurai for dinner – try the legendary Madurai Mutton Biryani or a Chettinad feast
- Overnight at your hotel in Madurai

# Madurai to Rameshwaram — Sacred Island at the Edge of India

*The drive from Madurai to Rameshwaram is one of the most evocative in all of India — crossing the legendary Pamban Bridge, a 2-kilometre rail and road*

*causeway that spans the Palk Strait to reach the sacred island of Rameshwaram. This is one of the holiest pilgrimages in Hinduism — the place where Lord Rama is said to have built his bridge to Lanka, and where the Ramanathaswamy Temple houses one of the twelve Jyotirlingas of Lord Shiva. The island is surrounded by the turquoise waters of the Indian Ocean, and the air carries the salt of three seas.*

## Morning — Departure from Madurai

- After breakfast, check out of your Madurai hotel
- Drive to Rameshwaram (approx. 170 km · 3.5 hours)
- Cross the iconic Pamban Bridge — India's first sea bridge, opened in 1914, stretching 2 km across the Palk Strait
- The crossing offers breathtaking views of the turquoise sea on both sides — one of India's most dramatic road journeys
- Arrive Rameshwaram and check in to your hotel

## Afternoon — Ramanathaswamy Temple

- Visit the Ramanathaswamy Temple — one of the holiest shrines in India and home to one of the twelve Jyotirlingas
- The temple's magnificent corridors are the longest in any Hindu temple in the world — stretching 1,220 metres
- Participate in the ritual of bathing in the 22 sacred theerthams (wells) within the temple complex — each believed to wash away sins
- Marvel at the exquisite granite pillars, each carved with intricate figures, lining the vast corridors

## Late Afternoon — Dhanushkodi & Adam's Bridge

- Drive to Dhanushkodi — the ghost town at the island's tip, destroyed by a cyclone in 1964
- Stand at the very edge of India where the Bay of Bengal meets the Indian Ocean — a hauntingly beautiful landscape of white sand and turquoise water
- View Adam's Bridge (Ram Setu) — the chain of limestone shoals stretching towards Sri Lanka, believed to be the bridge built by Lord Rama
- Visit Agnithiertham — the sacred beach where pilgrims take a ritual dip at the sea's edge

## Evening & Overnight

- Return to Rameshwaram town for dinner
- Experience the evening aarti at the Ramanathaswamy Temple — a deeply moving ceremony of light and devotion
- Overnight at your hotel in Rameshwaram

DAY 10

# Rameshwaram to Kanyakumari – Land's End & the Tri-Sea Confluence

*The southern most drive in India takes you from the sacred island of Rameshwaram to Kanyakumari—the very tip of the Indian sub continent, where the Arabian Sea, the Bay of Bengal and the Indian Ocean converge in a swirling confluence of colour and current. Kanyakumari is a place of extraordinary spiritual power – the site of the Devi Kanyakumari Temple, the Vivekananda Rock Memorial and the towering Thiruvalluvar Statue—and the only place in India where you can watch both the sunrise and the sunset over the sea.*

## Morning – Departure from Rameshwaram

- After breakfast, check out of your Rameshwaram hotel
- Drive south along the coast to Kanyakumari (approx. 170 km · 3.5 hours)
- En route, pass through the scenic coastal town of Tiruchendur – home to the famous Subramania Swamy Temple, one of the six abodes of Lord Murugan
- Arrive Kanyakumari and check in to your hotel with sea views

## Afternoon – Vivekananda Rock & Thiruvalluvar Statue

- Take a short ferry to Vivekananda Rock Memorial—built on the rock where Swami Vivekananda meditated in 1892 before his historic address at the Parliament of World Religions in Chicago
- Visit the Thiruvalluvar Statue – a 133-foot stone statue of the Tamil poet-saint Thiruvalluvar, standing on an adjacent rock in the sea
- Return by ferry and visit the Kanyakumari Devi Temple – dedicated to the virgin goddess Kanyakumari, an incarnation of Parvati

## Evening – Sunset at the Tri-Sea Confluence

- Walk to the southernmost tip of India – stand where three seas meet and feel the extraordinary energy of this sacred confluence
- Watch the legendary Kanyakumari sunset – the sky turns shades of gold, orange and crimson as the sun dips into the Arabian Sea
- Visit the Gandhi Memorial – built at the spot where Mahatma Gandhi's ashes were kept before immersion, designed so that sunlight falls on the exact spot on his birthday (October 2nd)

## Overnight Stay

- Dinner at your hotel overlooking the sea
- Overnight at your hotel in Kanyakumari

DAY 11

## Depart — Farewell, Land of Temples & Tides

Kanyakumari → Chennai International Airport · Approx. 700 km · Fly or Drive

*As your Tamil Nadu journey draws to a close, you'll wake to one final morning at the southern most tip of India — perhaps catching the legendary Kanyakumari sunrise, where the first light of dawn touches the confluence of three seas in a blaze of gold and rose. It is a fitting farewell to a land that has stirred the soul at every turn — from the soaring gopurams of Madurai to the sacred corridors of Rameshwaram, from the Chola grandeur of Thanjavur to the French elegance of Pondicherry. Tamil Nadu does not let go easily.*

### Morning — Kanyakumari Sunrise

Rise early for the legendary Kanyakumari sunrise — one of the most celebrated in India

Watch the sun emerge from the Bay of Bengal, casting its first light across the tri-sea confluence

A final visit to the Kanyakumari Devi Temple for morning prayers — a deeply moving farewell to God's Own South

Enjoy a leisurely breakfast at your hotel

### Departure

Check out of your hotel after breakfast

Transfer to the nearest airport (Trivandrum or Madurai) for your onward flight, or drive to Chennai for a late departure

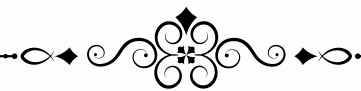
